



Susan Flynn Oncology Nursing Fellowship Summer 2024 UConn Health, Farmington, Connecticut

<u>Purpose</u>: UConn Health John Dempsey Hospital and UConn School of Nursing are honored to once again partner with the Flynn Foundation and the Susan Flynn Oncology Nursing Fellowship Program in 2024.

The Susan Flynn Oncology Nursing Fellowship Program was created to help stimulate and nourish the career interest and foster the professional development of **potential oncology nurses.** The program is focused on the vitally important field of oncology nursing. The fellowship will enhance the student's core clinical education through direct observation of oncology patient care, hands on oncology clinical experience, and exposure to related patient care duties and services that typify oncology nurses' valuable role and important interprofessional relationships with other members of the healthcare team. Opportunities to attend various pertinent John Dempsey Hospital/UConn Health educational programs and meetings with key staff members/committees will provide additional learning experiences for the student nurse. The fellowship at UConn Health is different from other Susan Flynn Fellowships that you may have been informed about. In addition to the typical elements of this fellowship program, you will be enrolled in a three (3) credit course via UConn School of Nursing and upon successful completion will earn these 3 credits. Course assignments will be required during the fellowship.

<u>Program Scope</u>: The fellowship program includes a comprehensive agenda of direct observational and hands on learning experiences, including exposure to:

- Oncology nursing (roles/responsibilities, applied practice, career opportunities)
- Medical-Surgical-Oncology (principles of patient care, treatment plans, key policies/procedures, patient education)
- Oncology clinic processes and routines (organization, functions, roles/responsibilities)
- Palliative/Supportive Care services (patient and family support, organization, functions, roles/responsibilities)
- Infusion services including chemotherapy and immunotherapy administration
- Radiation therapy

In addition, as part of this learning/development experience and in collaboration with the Program Coordinator and UConn faculty, *the student nurse will be required to complete coursework including an evidence-based*

practice project in some aspect of oncology nursing. The project presentation will take place at the completion of the program to UConn Health senior nursing administration and various discipline representatives.

<u>Program Schedule</u>: The program will span ten (10) weeks in length, in the summer between the junior and senior years from May 17, 2024 through July 25, 2024 and will be conducted at UConn Health/John Dempsey Hospital/Neag Cancer Center, Farmington, Connecticut. The schedule, 36 hours per week, will include a combination of three (3) twelve hour shifts (inpatient area) or four (4) or five (5) shifts (outpatient area) per week. Shift length will vary in the outpatient area to equal 36 hours per week, but four (4) 9-hour shifts is most common. The daily schedule may vary during the week.

<u>Compensation</u>: The student nurse will be paid \$15.00/hour for this fellowship program.

<u>Application Process</u>: This fellowship is being offered to two (2) eligible, Fall, 2023 seniors at the University of Connecticut School of Nursing. Applicants must have achieved and maintained at least a 3.2 GPA and be in good standing. - 1. An application cover letter
- 2. A current resume with a summary of clinical experiences
- A transcript from the UConn School of Nursing (SON), including your Fall Semester 2022 grades. If Fall Semester grades are not available, an updated transcript may be brought to the interview (official transcript must be received by 1/19/2024)
- 4. Two letters of recommendation from nursing faculty at UConn SON, one MUST be from the student's clinical faculty member
- 5. 1-2 page essay explaining why you want to become an oncology nurse and why we should choose you
- 6. A completed JDH employment application (will be provided separately if selected)

<u>Interview Process</u>: Applicants with a successful application packet review will be contacted. An interview with the UConn Health/JDH Flynn Fellowship Committee will be scheduled at a mutually convenient time. Interviews will be scheduled from January 3-19, 2024, at the John Dempsey Hospital, UCONN Health, Farmington campus.

<u>Note</u>: All applicants to the Flynn Fellowship are also eligible to concurrently apply to the UConn Health Nursing Student Intern Program (NSIP). Any applicant who wishes to be considered for both the Flynn Fellowship and the NSIP program should specify this in the cover letter.

<u>Notification of Program Acceptance</u> (tentative notification dates): Selected applicants will be notified by phone no later than **February 2, 2024**. Those applicants not selected will receive an email notification by February 2, 2024.

<u>Accepted Applicants-2024 Flynn Fellows</u>: Prior to starting as a Flynn Fellow, accepted students are required to undergo a pre-employment physical and complete & return all pre-employment paperwork.
